Have your say on A40 transport transformation

People are being asked for their views in the coming weeks on detailed plans for £180m worth of transport improvements planned for the A40 between Witney and Oxford.

Thriving communities need transport improvements

The bus lane project also includes new bus stops at Eynsham on the A40 and Westbound bus priority on the approaches to Cassington traffic signals and Eynsham roundabout.

Junction improvements between Eynsham park and ride and the Duke's Cut canal bridge near Wolvercote are also proposed. The two-way shared walking and cycling path along with the northern verge would be widened and the southern path would be retained.

Funded through growth

Construction is currently programmed to take place from 2019-2021 and it is expected that Eynsham park and ride will be subject to a planning application in spring 2019.

More improvements could be on the horizon

The consultation also shines a light on further potential improvements to the A40.

The council has the opportunity to submit a proposal to central government for further funding towards improvements to the A40, through the Housing Infrastructure Fund.

The proposal, worth up to £145m, are for measures complementary to the Eynsham Park and Ride and bus priority scheme.

Five scheme elements are planned including improvements to highway capacity by extending the A40 dual carriageway at Witney to Eynsham park and ride. There is also a proposal to improve bus journeys from Oxford through providing longer sections of westbound bus priority lane, and to widen the Duke's Cut Canal and Wolvercote Railway bridges to enable the eastbound bus lane towards Oxford to travel over this pinch point and into Wolvercote roundabout.

Improvements to cycle routes are also proposed. A new path from the A40 cycle route to National Cycle Route 5 on the Oxford Canal Tow path is proposed, as well as seeking to provide a long distance dedicated walking and cycling route from Eynsham to Botley along the B4044.

The December consultation seeks view on the conceptual designs of these transport scheme proposals for the A40 corridor.



This month I got kicked out of Cowley shopping centre by security for trying to interview members of the public for BBC Oxford, so my journalism career is still going well.

Eating such fine food helped to take my mind off of how bad the football teams I follow were doing, with AFC Bournemouth, Liverpool, and Oxford United all failing to win over a two-week period souring my mood. OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – Section 14(1)

> Notice of Temporary Traffic Order Yarnton, Cassington Road Prohibition of Through Traffic <u>Date of Order: 03/12/2018</u> Coming into force: 06/12/2018

This Order is being introduced to facilitate carriageway resurfacing which is anticipated to take until 20/12/2018 to complete. The effect of the Order is to temporarily prohibit any vehicle proceeding in that part of Cassington Road from the A44 westwards for 1200metres. Appropriate traffic signs will be displayed to indicate when the measures are in force. Exemptions are included for emergency services and for the works and for access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of road. The alternative through route is via the Cassington to Yarnton road to The Green, to Eynsham Road to A40 to A44 and vice-versa. This Order will remain in force for a maximum period of 18 months or until the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. 

Horsemere Lane Closure and A40

The Parish Council have asked for the closure and are still awaiting the public consultation process by Oxfordshire County Council. OCC will be carrying out a Public Consultation – Improving Transport along the A40 Corridor on Saturday 1st December 3pm to 6pm at Cassington Village Hall We would encourage everyone to attend.

Yellow cross hatching at the Cassington Lights

When asked before for the police to act they were unable because of the poor condition of the hatching. The intention now is to ask for the police to act. The Parish Council have also looked at the sequencing of the lights and will be requesting this be looked at.

The Parish Council have been promised that the remedial work will be completed this year.

Watermain flooding

Robert Courts has received a reply from Thames Water that did little to reassure they have plans in place to protect the village from a possible failure of the large main. The Parish Council will be asking for another meeting to establish what progress they are making.

Fix My Street

Residents are reminded that blocked gullies, drains, overgrown vegetation and potholes can be recorded on the OCC website at Fix My Street.

Neighbourhood Watch and Police presence in the village.

Plans are being prepared for the "no cold calling area" to be established. We have no further news on effective policing for our village. The national news continues to highlight the reduction in police numbers. It is a political issue which we can only change in national ballots/elections.

Oxfordshire County Council sapling and plaque to commemorate end of World War 1

The sapling and plaque are in place on the small Green in front of village hall. The Parish Council are underwhelmed by the size of the sapling and the plaque and will be making their own arrangements to replace with something more in keeping with the village.

Sports Pavilion and Play equipment

The section 106 money towards the costs of repairs has been paid by WODC to the Parish Council and the order for replacement windows and doors will now be placed.

Quotes are being sort for other works in the pavilion and significant work will be undertaken in the new year.

Update on Eynsham Garden Village from one of our WODC Councillor

On 25th October West Oxfordshire District Council held a 'Community Forum' in the Eynsham village hall – the first in a series of events to consult the public on the Garden Village. The invited guests from Eynsham village and wider area were put into groups and asked to come up with the success criteria for the project with the purpose of contributing to a vision statement. Later events, I am told, will get into more detail on subjects such as education and the environment.

My personal feeling is that there was no opportunity to get into any detail. Also by focusing solely on success criteria, no chance was given to address concerns, so some kind of SWOT analysis would have been better, to consider threats (to both current residents and the Garden Village) as well as opportunities. The most obvious threat for Cassington is the A40 getting even more congested with all the new housing, and so suitable infrastructure improvements must be a priority. For me, the proposed Park & Ride and bus lane is insufficient for the current problems, let alone enough to cope with the new developments.

The key thing I am stressing at council is the involvement of the community at every stage in decision making. The Garden Village will be a long project with the submission of the master plan expected in winter 2019
