**ROGUE TRADERS IN VILLAGE UPDATE** 

Over recent times, residents in Cassington and surrounding villages have been experiencing an ongoing issue with door to door sellers. They visit in groups and carry large holdalls selling various household items. They often present themselves as part of a rehabilitation program for ex-offenders. We can confirm that this program is NOT recognised or supported by the Police. Also any such traders require a Pedlars licence from WODC and these groups NOT have a licence to sell door to door.

They have been given the term 'Nottingham Knockers' as the concept originated from this region and the groups 'door knock' to obtain custom. The Police have advised AGAINST purchasing from these individuals. There is reported evidence that these groups target elderly and vulnerable residents. They often use intimidation & harassment and can cause damage to property if residents rebuke their offers. Also there is an increase likelihood of burglary and doorstep crime when these sellers visit an area.

It is thought that often the actual sellers get very little or none of the cash they receive from their sales. The money is taken by a group leader who may or may not offer lodging and food in return. This process under investigation by the Police but hard to prosecute effectively. If you wish to support, we suggest using regulated schemes in place to support crime rehabilitation.

If any local residents experienced harassment or intimidation during the last visit on Thurs 7th March, Police request this is reported REF 7th March CRIME NO 960. The PCSO team keen to arrange visits to reassure any concerned and vulnerable residents.

In summary, both the Police and Neighbourhood watch groups strongly advise NOT to communicate with these individuals and NOT to purchase.

COLD CALLING PROCESS TO ALERT VILLAGE

1. As soon these sellers are seen in the village, we ask everyone spreads word

ASAP. Communication via either WhatsApp or Facebook NHW group is great, as it quickly alerts a large group instantly. Details for both groups below.

2. Any of the local NHW coordinators should then (under directive of Inspector Steve Hookham) call 999 so they can notify patrols try to attend (resource allowing). The Police are very keen to catch these people as part on ongoing investigation

 Local NHW coordinators will then as quickly as possible visit any elderly / vulnerable to inform them (as likely they won't have access to Social Media or other online alerts).

4. All residents are then informed that these people are active in the village and we strongly advise NOT to answer the door and NOT to purchase goods.

5. If anyone receives any intimidation or finds sellers attempting to enter property, they should call 999. Local NHW coordinator will ensure they have their contact / mobile numbers for them to call if required too.

We would also like to suggest applying the 'No Cold Calling stickers' to front door of properties. These act as an effective deterrent and residents displaying these stickers should not receive any unwanted calls from sellers. Please let your local NHW coordinator know if you would like a sticker and we will distribute once received by PSCO team.

Long term, we wish to establish 'No Cold Calling Zone' for whole of the village. This work is ongoing with Trading standards and NHW & Parish council have identified as a priority matter.

#### Village Hall AGM 18 February 2019 Chair's Review of the Year "Not just a building, but building a community"

2018 was another year of steady progress for the hall. We maintained our pattern of bookings at almost exactly the same level as the year before, made some modest improvements to the facilities for hall users, and kept up with the demand for regular minor maintenance that's needed throughout the year. Many thanks to all our users, our donors, our volunteers, and our hard working team of committee members who made it happen. The hall continues to be a very popular community venue and a great asset, effectively owned by the village for the benefit of the village.

Our income from hall lettings for the year was virtually the same as the year before at £14,313 (£14,528 in 2017). We continued to organise successful events for the village including the monthly cinema screenings of recent releases and live performances from touring theatre companies, and although our total revenue for events and fund raising activities such as Bike Night was around a thousand pounds lower this year at £2,823 (£3,854 in 2017), the associated costs were a thousand pounds lower too at only £416 (£1,442 in 2017). So as well as providing a popular service for the village, our events also make a healthy profit, which is good news. Our income from donations was lower at £285 (£982 in 2017) but we received no major one-off donations this year, and this is a more usual level of regular donations. If we then add a little bank interest, investment income and Gift Aid, our total income for the year was £17,832 (£19,415 in 2017).

Looking at the costs of running the hall, our expenditure before depreciation was  $\pounds 15,079$  this year, which is up on the previous year's figure of  $\pounds 13,654$ . Although we had no major refurbishment costs in 2018, we spent  $\pounds 2,040$  on minor repairs and maintenance, which is much the same as the previous year's  $\pounds 1,946$ . We also invested approximately  $\pounds 5,000$  in a hundred much-needed new chairs for the hall. Our many thanks are due to Bryan Partridge in particular for his hard work in sourcing the new chairs and undertaking the painstaking consultation process to get to the right

answer. We were pleased to be able to donate the best of the old chairs to the Sports and Social Club.

So the end result financially, after allowing for slightly higher annual depreciation this year of £3,881 (£2,964 in 2017), was net outgoing resources of £1,128 for the year. That's the first time in three years that we've had an overall outgoing rather than incoming result, but our cash position is still very positive and the finances in good shape. To start the new year rolling, in the first week of January 2019 we had the main wooden floor professionally refurbished at a cost of some £2,000 to help keep the hall in top condition for all users.

Our hard-working volunteer trustees for the year were Ruth Bakewell (Events), Penny Burroughs (Secretary), Lorna Mills (Treasurer), Bryan Partridge (Vice-Chair and Buildings), Carol Mitchell (Parish Council, resigned during the year), Bridget Sherlock, and Di Williams. Very sadly, we also need to note the great loss of Frank Nelson in April 2018. A long-standing trustee of the hall, his wisdom and support are much missed. At around the same time, we were also very sad to lose our former long- serving treasurer Bill Arthy.

We are delighted that Malcolm Teal has continued to volunteer his services to the committee, even though he needed to stand down as a trustee during the year. This was to avoid any potential conflict of interest when we recruited Kathryn Teal in June as our new booking secretary and manager, following Nicky Copelin's decision to resign from this post in March 2018 to focus on her new NHS career. We wish Nicky well and owe her many thanks again for her outstanding long service.

Thank you Kathryn for all your hard work in your first year, and thanks again to Lorna Mills for stepping in during the gap of two months as acting booking secretary as well as treasurer. Thank you too to Rebecca Copelin our cleaner, and to those expert volunteers within the village who often fix things as needed without charge, in particular Dan Bakewell, Graham Mills, David O'Donnell, Matthew Terry and Paul Woolford.

We always welcome new volunteers to come and join our Committee, so if you're interested please do get in touch.

Well it is now official. Cassington Sports and Social Club has become a charity. Generally this will have no impact on the way we run - we shall continue to look after the facilities at the Playing Fields and, of course, continue with the much needed work improving and maintaining the Pavilion. However it does mean that if any tax payers want to make donations to us we can now claim gift aid, and at 25% of the value of the gift, it is well worth having!

Since last month we have been busy and we are pleased to confirm that an order has now been placed for the new playground. We've been very fortunate to receive funding from Cottsway, Tescos, the Cassington Parish Council and West Oxfordshire District Council in addition to money the Sports & Social Club have raised from events held over the last few years towards this project. We would like to thank these organisations for their contribution, everyone who has supported the fundraising events over the years and particular thanks to the Parish Council for their help in making this project happen.

The items of play equipment that have been purchased are a zip wire, a pod swing, a double perch and a pirouette. The new playground will be located in the far right corner of the playing fields behind the MUGA pitch and green gym and we hope it will all be installed in May or June this year.

Anyone who has been up to the Playing Fields recently will have seen we now have a path along the edge of the field, which is gently sloped up to the front door of the Pavilion providing better access for all, especially wheelchair users and those with buggies. In the Pavilion we are in the process of upgrading the toilet and shower facilities. The work to lay new flooring in these areas will be carried out at the beginning of April. There will be new benches in the changing rooms and new lighting throughout the hall. The loft is being insulated and you will have seen in last month's CAWN that we are arranging for a skip to take away the junk (or is it valuable treasure) that has accumulated over the years. We don't have a date for this yet, but when we do we would appreciate all the help we can get clearing it out.

As you will have seen, in the last edition of CAWN, we are planning to hold a Family Fun Day celebration at the Playing fields on Saturday 15 June, so please do make sure you have the date in your diary. We are planning to start at around 3pm and continue until 8pm or thereabouts. We will be selling hot dogs and burgers from the barbecue from about 5.30pm and teas, coffees, cold drinks and possibly something stronger will be available all day. We shall be holding an official opening of the new playground area and equipment, and other sports and activities will be running throughout the afternoon, including rounders, hockey and of course a tug of war. There will also be a "pram race" - see the advert elsewhere in this edition.

This is your charity, so do please get involved and support us if you can. We all know what a wonderful village this is, and we are doing our best to keep it that way. Sports and Social committee meetings are open to all and we welcome anyone who wants to join and help run this charity. We usually meet on Sunday evenings in the Red Lion. Our next meeting is on Sunday 7th April at 9pm. So do come along and get involved!





Christians have tried to keep both these commandments down through the Centuries with varying levels of success.

**OUR MAUNDY THURSDAY MASS of THE LORD'S SUPPER** commemorates this event. The Priest washes the feet of some of the people and then Mass (the Ceremony of the Bread and Wine) follows. We then move to our Garden of Gethsemane where people take it in turns to Watch in Prayer till Midnight following the request of Jesus to his disciples to "Watch and Pray". They fell asleep and were only woken when the soldiers came and arrested Jesus.

**GOOD FRIDAY** reminds us how our failures hurt others and most of all hurt God, as we think of him suffering and dying nailed to a cross. OUR LITURGY at 3.00pm includes a Reading of the whole of that story as told in the Gospel of St John, followed by Solemn Prayers and a time for all to come forward and kneel at the foot of the Cross in sorrow and thanksgiving that God loves us so much.

**HOLY SATURDAY NIGHT** is when Easter begins. OUR LITURGY starts 8.00pm outside with the Easter Fire and the Easter Candle and then, lighting our own candles, we process into a darkened Church to listen to a series of Readings, before Easter really begins as the Lights go on, the Bells are rung, and we celebrate our First Mass of Easter.

**EASTER SUNDAY MORNING** continues the celebration with our usual Mass at 10.00am.



#### Horsemere Lane Closure and A40

The consultation process has been revisited because of an error in the previous consultation and results should be available next month.

The Parish Council have highlighted their concerns of the extra traffic that will use the Cassington Lights at a meeting with our MP Robert Courts on the closure of Horsemere Lane. Robert Courts has promised to take this up with Oxfordshire County Council highways.

There is a need to change the sequencing of the lights and also a new slip road for traffic toward Oxford.

#### **Benches on the Green.**

Two benches have been installed on the Green and a further bench will soon be installed outside the Red Lion.

#### Watermain flooding

Thames Water have had a senior manager investigate the problems and solutions around the two water mains and have concluded that the valves so far installed are enough to handle any future fractures in the mains. The Parish Council are not happy with this solution and will be writing to Ofwat to seek their opinion.

#### **Fix My Street**

Residents are reminded that blocked gullies, drains, overgrown vegetation and potholes can be recorded on the OCC website at Fix My Street.

#### **Sports Pavilion**

Further progress has been made this month and hopefully the new flooring to the changing rooms and toilets will be installed next month. A grant of £5000 was received from Blenheim this month which will enable other planned further improvements to be made.

In this issue our coordinators will be highlighting the need for residents to be very vigilant with doorstop sellers. A pedlar's licence issued by WEST OXFORDSHIRE DISTRICT Council is required to sell at your doorstep.



#### Oxfordshire County Council statement on the B4044 community path

There has been much media coverage in recent days about funding bids and plans for a cycle path along the B4044 between Oxford and Eynsham. The response we have been providing to media outlets is below and explains why we have not been able to pursue funding for this cycle path for the Housing Infrastructure Fund. As we explain, we continue to want to deliver the scheme.

Our original proposals included the B4044 Community Path within the business case. Through the process of developing the bid we need to provide evidence all the scheme package elements we seek funding for meet and contribute to the funding criteria.

We were required to provide evidence as to how the B4044 Community Path would unlock new homes which would not otherwise be built without it being in place. It is our assessment, that if challenged, we would not be able to adequately demonstrate that it is essential to the delivery of housing at Witney and Eynsham (or elsewhere in Vale of White Horse). For this reason the scheme would not meet the Housing Infrastructure Fund criteria. Based on this information the council has taken the difficult decision to remove the B4044 Community Path from the package of measures in the Housing Infrastructure Fund business case.

The council proposes to identify internal revenue funding to continue to develop the scheme design along the same timeframes as proposed, as if Housing Infrastructure Fund funding was being sought. It is therefore proposed that the design will continue to take place during 2019/20 with a key output to ensure the design is cost effective and value for money.

Progressing the design now will ensure that a scheme for the B4044 Community Path is ready to submit to future funding opportunities as they arise, where the scheme meets the criteria. By having a 'shovel ready' scheme, funding opportunities that have short time frames can be applied for, which is often the case with external funding sources.

We understand this change of approach will be a disappointment to those who have long campaigned to see the cycle route constructed as soon as possible. Throughout this process we will keep stakeholders engaged and seek their views as the design work progresses.

#### Churchill hospital lost contract to carry out cancer scans

I discovered this week that despite its international reputation for cancer care, the Churchill hospital has lost its contract to carry out cancer scans to a private company, who will set up the scanners at two new locations which are yet to be revealed. I must admit I was disappointed to hear this news for several reasons. First and foremost, like many of you I suspect, I have had friends who have benefited enormously from the skill and expertise of the staff in in the Churchill oncology unit who rely heavily on the 3D scanner, which helps the medical staff spot tumours and monitor treatment regimes. If the scanners go then it is safe to assume that those staff and their skill will too. Second, we need to ask where the new service will be provided? As I write, friends from Taunton stayed with us last night in order to attend a medical appointment in Oxford today - would you be happy with a similar kind of arrangement if you needed a cancer scan? Finally, and perhaps most ominously, specialist cancer doctors at the Churchill, said they have "concerns about the potential impact on the safety and quality of patient care at the loss of the current PET-CT service at the Churchill". If you have a view on this can I urge you to share it with our MP Robert Courts as a matter of priority. He can be contacted on robert.courts.mp@parliament.uk
