Cassington and Worton News

Update on local development issues

Six months after I was given the honour of representing Cassington and with a General Election upon us, I thought it would be a good time to set out some thoughts about where we are

The first thing to say is that Cassington is going to be affected by the massive developments happening near it. The Cotswold Garden Village, A40 Park and Ride, the bus lanes, possible closure of Horsemere Lane and redesign of the junction of Eynsham Road with the A40 will all impact on you. The County Council are considering large scale gravel extraction in the land between Cassington and Eynsham – that is the route used by people cycling between the villages.

Cassington and Eynsham are taking more than their fair share of the development of the area. We have been signed up to take thousands of homes as part of the Oxfordshire Growth deal with no guarantee that they will be genuinely affordable for local people. The Garden Village has the potential to be a brilliant place, but only if people there can get around inside the village and over to Eynsham without having to get in their cars. That means being able to cross the A40 safely and directly. But the A40 is about to be widened with non-continuous bus lanes, and with additional traffic going to the Park and Ride.

It would be nice to be able to report that the new bus lanes will work but few people here think the Park and Ride will make the traffic flow better. And most of Cassington is quite a long way from a convenient bus stop.

I hope that we will be allowed to reconsider our Local Plan in the future – but South Oxfordshire have recently been banned by the Sec of State for Communities from even discussing amending its plan.

I would urge everyone to use the forthcoming elections to make sure that our voice is heard.



- 12 December: Full moon, called the Moon Before Yule.
- 14/15 December: Geminids meteor shower. Lots of shooting stars, although the moon is quite bright this year.
- 21/22 December: Ursids meteor shower. Only 5-10 shooting stars per hours but close to the new moon, increasing your chances of seeing a Christmas shooting star.
- 26 December: New moon, great for Yuletide stargazing.

Election Manifestos and Campaign Busses.

(First published in CAWN May 2017.)

It is a blessing and a privilege to live in a democracy (although living under a benevolent dictator might be easier!). However, living in a democracy puts the responsibility on each-and-every one of us to (at least) find out something about the candidates & their policies, and then to use our vote as our conscience dictates. I find it very sad that many people do not vote at all.

The political parties produce their "Party Manifestos" often making great promises, painting a "glossy" future - if only we would give them our vote.

The temptation is to swallow the particular manifesto promises that appeal to each of us, "hook, line and sinker" and be caught like a fish on a line.

However, manifesto aspirations are not rigid promises. The very nature of politics means that there is always room for (and requirement to) compromise. Also, many other factors can change both nationally and internationally that can push manifesto pledges onto the back burner. Very little can be "etched in stone" in politics.

My apologies if I sound rather cynical about politicians. I am sure that many (if not most) have this country and us, its people, at heart. So, let us be grateful for those who are willing to take on this responsibility to act for us.

If party manifestos are just aspirations then by contrast I believe that the biblical promises made to us are solid and unequivocal.

One of the bible "sentences" used at the start of the funeral service is written by St Paul to the fledgling Roman church. He says in chapter 8 verses 38-39: (page 174 in your Jubilee New Testament)

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Does this mean that we all have a heavenly home in Jesus Christ – a sort of universalism? I don't believe so – and I don't believe that Jesus ever taught this.

In the run-up to the election we will see campaign buses around the country. If the way to our heavenly home were a bus then we all have the opportunity to travel to our heavenly destination - but we still have to get on the bus!

Just like the voter on election day we are required to be active in the process.

Please don't waste your vote, - or miss the bus.



They say absence makes the heart grow fonder, and that certainly rings true once you leave university. When I was at uni, of course I enjoyed spending time with the friends I made there, but, as with many things that become normal in life, you quickly take it for granted. Now that I don't see those folks as regularly anymore, it only makes me appreciate those friendships and look forward to seeing them again even more, so I was delighted to catch up with a couple of old chums in London this past month.

Being in Norwich, I'm naturally a bit out in the sticks, but Jon and Dan both live and work in London. Jon lives in a place called Edgware, very close to where the Channel 4 comedy Friday Night Dinner was filmed, if any CAWN readers have had the pleasure of watching that show. Dan is from Bournemouth but moved to London to start a job at the Daily Mail, which of course I often remind him is not the highest quality newspaper, but everyone starts somewhere. The paper might have a bad reputation, but he is a sound lad.

But I digress. Now that I've brought you up to date on who we are and what we're doing, allow me to tell you about our little weekend in the capital. The first port of call was The Hive, otherwise known as Barnet FC's football stadium, because what's a weekend with the lads without a little bit of the beautiful game? It wasn't the best match, in truth, but it didn't need to be because we were having fun catching up on the terraces, having not seen each other for a few months. It did brighten up towards the end, though. Barnet had been 2-0 down to Woking but brought it back to 2-1. With just minutes remaining, they equalised and made it 2-2, bringing about 'absolute limbs' in the stadium. For older readers, that phrase refers to wild celebrations, often with arms and legs flailing all over the shop. Enjoyable, even though none of

us care about Barnet.

After a night out in Camden, myself and Dan returned to our abode for the night - the cheapest hostel we could find in Hendon. It may have only cost us £20 each and my work colleagues may have tried to dissuade me from staying there because it looked a bit like a prison, but it actually represented very good value for money and we had a decent sleep in our dorm with 19 other random people we had never met! I may be earning money on a full-time job now, but I'm still just as frugal as I was at uni when it comes to spending it. Old habits die hard. I had to look up how to spell 'frugal' there, because I almost wrote 'frugle', which apparently means something very, very different indeed.

On the Sunday, we went to Southbank and enjoyed riding the dodgems and shooting some skittles on the bowling alley at this games room called Namco, under the shadow of a heavily-under-construction, depressing looking Big Ben. I felt that the appearance of the Great Bell and Westminster as a whole in October 2019 accurately reflected our country's political climate, which is to say, it looked dismal. My personal situation was almost equally dismal when my phone ran out of battery and I didn't have a ticket to show the National Express driver to get back to Norwich that evening, because what's a CAWN column without a crisis from me? My phone said it had 11 percent battery left when it died, and I was worried such fake news would prevent me from being allowed to board the coach. However, faith in humanity was duly restored when, much to my relief, the driver simply said 's*** happens,' and allowed me to get on. That was very understanding of him, but it also means that I could have never bought a ticket in the first place, although that would have been very unethical of me. Luckily, three hours or so later I did make it back to Norwich and walked from the bus station back to my house.

The trust's biggest project has been restoring Oxford Castle which is open to the public for the first time in 1,000 years and plans for every primary school age child in Oxfordshire to visit the castle and learn it's history. There are wonderful buildings to visit too like the Merchant's House in Abingdon built in 1450, the restoration of the Martry's Memorial and Maudlin Bridge. Many interesting features are being uncovered as they work to preserve the covered market. I have probably rambled on enough now but I'm sure you get my gist!


