Your garden birds – what do you call them?

Like many people at this time of the year I enjoy seeing, but usually listening, to the birds in my garden. Given the current lockdown circumstances I can spend more time than usual keeping an eye (and an ear) on what my feathered friends are up to.

A week or so ago I was sitting having a mug of tea and enjoying a wren booming out his song. Despite being the third smallest bird in Britain they can certainly make a din! I was transported back to my childhood where all my spare time was spent roaming my local woodlands and riversides, remembering all the birds I would seek out avidly. Back then a wren to me would either be a "Jenny wren" or, in the breeding season, a "finger-poke" based on the structure of the nest they build, which posed a challenge to us egg collectors (I know dreadful admission for a conservation biologist!). The wren builds a dome shaped nest with a hole for an entrance, the nest completely concealing the bird as they incubate their eggs and chicks. It is this dome shaped nest that gives the wren its scientific name – Troglodytes troglodytes – a troglodyte being a cave dweller. But why "Jenny" wren?

Giving birds a familiar name was commonplace in the English folk-naming of birds and probably owes its origins to a time when to refer to anyone by their Christian name was to imply familiarity or friendship. So, the common garden birds were the recipients of their affectionate names – hedge Betty (dunnock), Tommy tit (great tit) and Mavis (song thrush). Note that the names are most often in their diminutive form (Betty = Elizabeth) rather than in full, most likely a link to parents teaching their children how to identify common garden birds and possibly to characterise them as friends, worthy of our care and consideration.


Quite by chance my newest garden bird of the year- the willow

warbler singing from my neighbour's garden - provided me with even more to ponder from my youth. To me they were always "banky feathercocks", this a link to the location and type of nest they build - low down in the vegetation, in a feather-lined nest similar in structure to that of the wren. Fondly I remembered my painful excursions looking for the nests of the banty's cousin - the "nettle Peggy" (whitethroat) - listen out for them at the allotments (and again note the inclusion of a diminutive Christian name). I am reliably informed that the whitethroat is more widely referred to as the "nettle creeper", with the "Peggy" suffix something of a South Yorkshire "ism". This gives me an many of these names were given to our garden birds at a time when local travel was almost non-existent. A time when hard-working folk relied on the rural landscape for their living, forging a relationship with the plants and animals that they saw on a daily basis. As such, many of these names are only recognised at the regional level, with sometimes very different names given to the same species in adjacent counties and even, in some instances, villages. There are many other common birds which we see and hear which have folk-lore names derived from either their nesting habits, their song or some quirky aspect of their behaviour. The lexicon of names for the occupants of our countryside has always fascinated me and I would love to hear of any you know of, especially those linked to the Oxford region. I bring this to a close looking forward to more arrivals in and around our gardens, none more so than the now increasingly rare "devil bird" or perhaps you know it as the "thunder swallow"? Hopefully they will be here by the time you read this!

Social isolation and loneliness had been identified as key issues for our society well before the rise of the COVID-19 pandemic. Theresa May labelled loneliness as "one of the greatest public health challenges of our time" and launched a government first 'loneliness strategy' in 2018.

Social isolation has been used as a punishment throughout history and used still, whether in schools (detention) or prisons (solitary confinement) – it is hurtful for any social being. There are numerous studies linking social isolation with a higher risk of death.

In fact, studies have found socialising may lower your risk of dementia as well as boosting your mental wellbeing and cognitive functioning. In fact, after a quick online search you will find that socialising is the best drug you've already been taking, and I don't know about you, but I'm already feeling the withdrawal symptoms...

For most of us, our colleagues are also our friends, and work is a large part of our week. To go from 35+ hours of face-to-face contact down to zero will likely be a shock to the system.

Maintaining communication with your colleagues and your organisation will not only be important for the business but also for every person within it – none of us are immune to social seclusion.

Being socially connected should be considered as important to our wellbeing as eating or sleeping.

What ideas do you have to stay physically distant but still socially connected? It would be great to hear any ideas you have on how to stay connected to your colleagues, staff or friends and family.



<u>May 21st is Ascension day</u> (40 days after Easter) celebrating Jesus' return to heaven. Jesus' last words before leaving were recorded in Matthew's Gospel chapter 28 verse 20: (p37 in your Jubilee New Testament)

"...surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

In these challenging times I would encourage you to look at our strong and steadfast church building and take comfort in these eternal and steadfast promises of God's presence.

DO ONE GREEN THING

The enforced time spent at home and the good weather over the last month have combined to give those of us lucky enough to have gardens a greater

appreciation of them. Gardening can be an expensive and time-consuming hobby, but if you want to do something for the environment, creating a wildlife-friendly zone at home can be both easy and cheap. Here are some ideas:

- **∞ Keep an area of lawn unmown.** Insects such as crickets and grasshoppers thrive in long grasses so having a less manicured green area will encourage them into your garden.
- № Make a pond. It doesn't have to be large or expensive and can be as simple as creating a hole and lining it with an old washing up bowl filled with rainwater. Use sticks or stones to create escape routes out of the pond for small animals. Watery areas like this are good for damselflies and dragonflies as well as water snails and other small pond insects. You may even attract frogs and other amphibians.
- ∾ Plant bee-friendly flowers. Single flowered varieties (i.e. those with a single row of petals and open faces) are best as they make it easy for bees to reach the pollen. Bees see the colour purple better than any other colour, so plants like lavender, alliums, buddleja (also a butterfly favourite) and catmint are ideal.
- **Create a log pile.** Next time you cut back your trees keep some of the logs to create a pile that can act as a habitat for beetles, toads and larger animals like hedgehogs. Place the log pile in a shady spot so it remains cool and damp.
- Let your ivy grow. Ivy can become rampant if left unchecked but keeping a bit growing in your garden creates a cosy environment for overwintering helpful insects such as ladybirds. They will repay you in spring and summer by munching on pests like aphids, meaning you can cut back on harmful pesticide use.

LOOK AFTER YOUR MENTAL HEALTH.
Use your extra leisure time to do all those things you never get round to – the skills you'd like to learn (check out online tutorials), books you've been meaning to read, etc.

LEAVE THE HOUSE IF YOU ARE ILL. If you or any member of your household has symptoms, all members of the household must remain at home for 14 days.

DO NOT VISIT FRIENDS AND RELATIVES. The more contact we have with others, the greater the chance of spreading the virus.

LOSE CONTACT WITH FRIENDS AND FAMILY. Keep in touch via phone, email, Facetime and other contactless forms of contact. Join the Cassington Village Facebook group to keep in touch with other villagers.

DO NOT SUSE THE GREEN GYM EQUIPMENT IN THE PARK, OR THE CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT. The virus can linger on such surfaces, which are not cleaned regularly.

DO NOT WORRY. If we all pull together and follow the guidelines above we will get through this.





Weekly Village Store – 250 deliveries made in April!

Since the beginning of Lockdown, Cassington Neighbourhood support group has been running a Village store / delivery service every Wednesday. To date they have received and processed orders covering up to 60 households weekly in the village, helping those who are shielding, self-isolating or in need of supplies direct to their homes. Fresh fruit and vegetables have been sourced from Bonners the Green Grocers based in Oxford Covered Market. Savona Foods also supply fresh milk, bread, pasta, flour and other store cupboard ingredients. - 1. Friday: New order form is updated and emailed to residents
- 2. Sunday midday: Completed form to be returned via email. We have a deadline for orders so we can place orders with suppliers on Monday

If someone is unable to send electronically, please discuss you requirements with your NHW coordinator, they will produce an order for you.

3. Wednesday: Orders bagged & deliveries made. We ask that you don't come to collect so we can minimise the contact and people coming to the hall.

If the demand is greater than supply, we will prioritise elderly, self-isolating and vulnerable and key workers first.

- 5. We will deduct the value of your order from your donation and remaining balance will be used for further orders. You can top up accordingly.

We know food supplies and shopping has been difficult for everyone, particularly those of you being asked to self-isolate or operate social distancing. Also many key workers are working long hours and struggle to shop and eat well too. So we hope this donated meal helps raise spirits and provides a healthy meal for anyone who needs it at this time. This meal can either be keep frozen for a later date or reheated using the instructions on the packaging.
