### December stargazing highlights

#### **Dec 13: Geminids Meteor Shower**

This is the considered to be the king of the meteor showers. The best viewing will be after midnight. Meteors radiate from Gemini but can be seen anywhere in the sky.

#### **Dec 14: New Moon**

The new moon will not be visible so this is the best night for viewing far off galaxies and star clusters.

## **Dec 21: December Solstice and Ursids Meteor Shower**

A minor meteor shower with meteors radiating from Ursa Minor

## Dec 21: Rare Conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn

These two bright planets will come so close together they will appear to make a bright double planet. Look to the west just after sunset.

#### **Nov 30: Full Moon**

The Moons face will be full illuminated. This was known by the Native American tribes as the Cold Moon. It has also been known as the Long Night's Moon and the Moon before Yule.

I have been asked to pass on a big "Thank you" from both the North Oxfordshire Community Food Bank and the Eynsham Food Bank for the recent generous donations from Cassington. In recent weeks the box outside St Peter's church has received large amounts of donations enabling us to support both of the two local food banks alternately with multiple bags of canned and dried food as well as cash donations fortnightly.

However, there has been an increasing number of families reliant on these food banks and, with the run up to Christmas, even more families and individuals are finding themselves in food poverty.

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SUPPORT

As we go into winter, and possibly further periods of lockdown, all of the Neighbourhood watch team continue to offer our help and support to those residents in need. Hopefully many of the initial issues with food availability and travel restrictions have eased. We have set up regular weekly home deliveries from both Bonners (Green Grocer and other provisions) and Bartlett's Butchers (Meat, Eggs and many other goods). Also we understand Milk and More Milk service has availability for new customer slots. We hope that these provide an alternative to Supermarkets deliveries if needed. Eynsham Pharmacy also offer a delivery service, which is quick and easy to set up for home deliveries.

However we recognise the coming months could prove difficult and challenging again. Please do contact us, if you do need help with supplies. Unfortunately the Cassington regular volunteer driver services aren't currently available due to their need to shield. However we do have some options available for those in need, so please contact us if you need help.

Eynsham Food Bank is also a good friend to the village. We have worked together to help any residents that need additional help with food and supplies at this time. Please do reach out to us if this would help and we can arrange home deliveries to be made. You can contact your local NHW coordinator or Vicky and Julie. Any requests for support would be treated in confidence and we would be very happy to assist getting help to those in need.

Lastly we appreciate that this extended period of isolation for many residents has been tough and feelings of loneliness or low mood are very common. Again we are here to help and happy to provide regular check ins and conversation.



Christmas greetings to all our friends and neighbours in Cassington this year and may 2021 be a very different year for us all! We will support Gatehouse in lieu of usual festivities.

## Beating Lockdown Blues: The Green Heart of Cassington Update on the Blenheim Estates Development Proposal

With winter sinking its very wet teeth in you would think all would be quiet on the Allotment Front. Quite the contrary. I was there last weekend and a host of allotmenteers were spreading muck, building raised beds and clearing areas to grow even more. This is also the time for planting garlic. Samuel Serra's wildlife camera has been capturing foxes and deer foraging at night-time when a whole different world awakes in the absence of humans when the sun sets.

Likewise the Green Heart of Cassington has also been busy this week. We are collating the statements published in CAWN and posted to all residents in Cassington. I have been incredibly impressed by many of the comments made by my fellow villagers from children, and whole families all the way to our most senior residents. Major concerns include massive overdevelopment, traffic, parking, flooding and loss of such an important community asset and a haven for wildlife. The Save Cassington Allotments petition has now been signed by over 8,600 people. An article is also on the way in Land Magazine.

Some of you may also be aware that the Parish Council met with Blenheim Estates to express their many concerns with the proposed development. The recording of this meeting is available from the Parish Clerk if you wish to listen. Blenheim Estates were clearly optimistic that they could deal with most of the concerns such as parking, flooding, etc. and appeared adamant that they were allowed to build on Green Belt land because of new government legislation with regards to affordable housing and also that the development would remain at the present size. They also appeared baffled that everyone thought this was a development of rental homes. Clearly, their representatives were not aware of the text in their own pamphlet: "These homes are managed and cared for by Blenheim Estate Homes and offered at 40% discount to market rental".

We are preparing a formal objection to the planning proposal when it comes as well as now also seeking to list the Allotment as an Asset of Community Value and looking into the importance of the allotments to wildlife. In the meantime, I sincerely thank everyone who has signed the pledges and to anyone who has not signed but would like to it is not too late. Please let us know and we will collect them or place them in the first Greenhouse on the right in the Allotment.

I must also thank all my fellow allotmenteers who are working incredibly hard to fend off this development especially Julie, Jaime, Nav, Steve, Samuel, Simon, Simon, Austin and Guy! May Cassington allotments thrive for another 100 years!

#### **Anti-bullying activities**

During the last month it has been anti-bullying week and to help raise awareness, the children engaged in lots of activities. On Monday 16th November it was 'Odd Socks Day' where many of the children and staff came in wearing odd socks to celebrate that we are all unique! We raised an amazing £74 which will go to the Anti-bullying Alliance who produce many of the materials that we have been using this week. The next day, Carmen Fraser led collective worship and shared a story of a boy who was made to feel bad because he could not ride a bike; we learned how important kindness is. This was followed up on Wednesday where the children were read a book called 'Weslandia' where a child, Wesley, used what made him different to change the bullies' attitudes and open their eyes to a better way! Through showing them kindness and letting them play his games, they became great friends.

#### **David Attenborough inspired projects**

Our class based, David Attenborough inspired, environmental projects are starting to gather pace and after listening to all the children's ideas, we now have a plan for the year! Each class will take specific actions to educate themselves and others, and bring about lasting change at school. This term, Willow will be learning about deforestation and palm oil and are working on a class project to raise awareness; Maple class are investigating overfishing and pollution of the seas and are having a poster competition to encourage people to make good environmental choices; Oak will be investigating what animals live in our forest school and how we can encourage more creatures to make the site their home; and Apple will be feeding the birds over winter and making a place for our local hedgehogs to hibernate. Mrs Houghton (Forest School Leader) is investigating with the SPSA (St Peter's School Association) the possibility of having trail cameras and bird box cameras on site so we can observe St Peter's creatures as the seasons progress. #### MORE ABOUT THE SPSA

The SPSA is run by parents and carers of pupils at St Peter's School to help fund different activities and equipment for the school. Unfortunately, our usual fundraising was derailed this year with lockdown, including - of course - Bike Night, discos, the swimming pool and the Spring/Summer and Christmas Fairs.

Every year, we provide £500 to each class to subsidise trips and visits. We give all the children in Years 1 to 6 a trip to see a Christmas Panto, and we'll also help pay for other things the school might need.

For example, last year we purchased 15 chrome books to make up the 30 needed for a whole class to learn with them. They proved invaluable for home-schooling during the first lockdown. We've recently purchased 10 more to add to the school's additional 20, so there are now enough for two classes to use them in their learning — and enough so that no child from Year 1 upwards would miss out if we found ourselves home-schooling again. We want to be ready to help minimise any disruption that Covid might bring, so the children continue to flourish in our very special village school.

#### Christmas is cancelled?

Boris can't cancel Christmas - can he? We have always celebrated Christmas - right? Well no! In the 1600's Oliver Cromwell's parliament banned Christmas as a holiday. Celebrations were outlawed and it was illegal in any of the English territories to even go to church for a special service on Christmas day.

The puritan argument centred on the fact that there was, and remains, no evidence in the bible of Christ's birth in midwinter, let alone Dec 25th. Furthermore, there was also great concern that the festival had been taken over by immoral revelry and general excess. (Not much change there then.)

However, the ban was short lived and when the monarchy was restored under Charles II so was the celebration of Christmas. (However, it is interesting that the Christmas ban in Scotland remained law until 1957!)

In contrast to our current pandemic, during Cromwell's ban of Christmas shops and businesses were ordered to stay open and treat the day as an ordinary working day without feast or fanfare.

The church today has embraced the general celebration of Christmas (although it is not universally accepted by all Christian denominations for the same reasons as in the 1600's) However, even with the potential of several vaccines becoming available for mass inoculations very soon this Christmas is likely to be very different for most of us. BUT...

#### CHRISTMAS IS NOT CANCELLED!

Christmas is the celebration of the incarnation of God in Christ. God, in Christ, becoming man, to reveal himself to us. Furthermore, Christ also becoming our redeemer & Saviour, to restore us in relationship with Him - this is worth a great celebration of thanksgiving.

How we will celebrate this Christmas may be very different this year – maybe a much smaller turkey? – but let us stay in contact with friends and family using all the modern communications at our disposal. Let us continue to remember our neighbours, and the poor, and disadvantaged, both near and far. These are good and important things even if how we do them may be different, but the key message of Christmas is not different - God coming to us to live amongst us, and to save us, in the person of Jesus Christ.

You may like to read again the account of Jesus' birth in Luke's gospel chapters 1 and 2 (page 62 in your Jubilee New Testament.) The angel said to the shepherds, "...'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah (or Christ), the Lord. This will be a sign to you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Luke 2:9-

Lastly, this Christmas will be difficult for many people. If this Christmas is difficult for you, for any reason, then the church is still open (for as long as we can keep it so), and clergy are available. (Clergy details are on the St Peter's Church page)

#### **WODC Rubbish News!**

West Oxfordshire District Council is removing all 15 of its community recycling sites following a rise in littering and flytipping. Residents are urged to make full use of their kerbside blue bin recycling service which can handle a wide variety of items including batteries, cooking oil and electricals as well as paper, cans, glass and cardboard. Extra items can be put in a box alongside the blue wheelie bin while excess items can be taken to the Dix Pit household recycling centre at Stanton Harcourt or one of the other Oxfordshire recycling centres. Councillors have also agreed to increase the number of items that can be disposed of using the bulky waste service from three to four with the fee being frozen at £27.68. Traders are urged to use the Council's commercial waste service. Anyone caught fly-tipping will be prosecuted and fined.
