TREE AND HEDGE PLANTING AT ST PETER'S SCHOOL

On Saturday 26th February, with the help of some wonderful and skilled volunteers from the village, we planted around 1000 saplings that will create a hedge and diverse habitat for wildlife along the forest school side of the field and the pond side.



The children have also each planted their own sapling and we have a rota system for ensuring they are well



watered and cared for at lunchtimes. It will be an interesting race between the youngest children in the school and the hedge as to which will be taller by the time they get to year 6! Top Power Wash in Eynsham have been incredibly generous and given us a 50m hose which will make the adults' summer watering task a lot easier.

A huge thank you to the expert knowledge and organisation of Stew Thompson and volunteers Alex Rogers, Helena Nielsen, Graham Mills, James Clarke,



Lesley & Peter Sharpin, and also to Mark Finch who gave his time and two of his workers for the day. Mark also kindly donated and fitted trellis work at the end of the field which looks absolutely amazing — our sincerest thanks. It was a glorious day for weather and so lovely to work with such a wonderful team of people (The sight of Bridget bringing sandwiches was a glorious sight, thank you!).



And of course a huge, huge thank you to the everpresent Emily, who as always gives so much of her time to the school. For the arborists among you, the species we have planted are: Downy

Birch, Hornbeam, Hazel, Beech, Crab Apple, Blackthorn and Rowan.

Elections 2021

Elections are due to take place on 6 May 2021 for both Oxfordshire County Council and West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC), which was postponed from May 2020.

In order to vote you need to be registered on the electoral roll. You can register on line at https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/voter or you can contact WODC. The deadline to register to vote is midnight on Monday 19th April.

Arrangements are being put in place to make voting as Covid safe as possible, however if you are concerned about going to vote in person then you can apply for a postal vote. You do this by applying online using the same website as shown above or by contacting WODC. The deadline to apply for a postal vote is 5pm on Tuesday 20th April 2021.

If you are unable to make it to the polling station, then you can nominate someone to be your proxy and cast your vote for you. The proxy needs to be a registered voter and able to attend the voter's own polling station. Applications for proxy voting need to be sent to the District Council by no later than 5pm on Tuesday 27 April.

April stargazing highlights

April 12 - New Moon.

The Moon will be located on the same side of the Earth as the Sun and will not be visible in the night sky. This is the best time of the month to observe faint objects such as galaxies and star clusters because there is no moonlight.

April 22-23 - Lyrids Meteor Shower

The Lyrids is an average shower, usually producing about 20 meteors per hour at its peak. The shower runs annually and peaks this year on the night of the 22nd and morning of the 23rd. These meteors sometimes produce bright dust trails that last for several seconds. The nearly full moon will be a problem this year. Its glare will block out all but the brightest meteors. But you may still be able to catch a few good ones. Best viewing will be from a dark location after midnight. Meteors will radiate from the constellation Lyra, but can appear anywhere in the sky..

April 27 - Full Moon Supermoon

The Moon will be located on the opposite side of the Earth to the Sun and its face will be will be fully illuminated. This full moon was known by early Native American tribes as the Pink Moon because it marked the appearance of the moss pink, or wild ground phlox, which is one of the first spring flowers. This moon has also been known as the Sprouting Grass Moon, the Growing Moon, and the Egg Moon. Many coastal tribes called it the Fish Moon because this was the time that the shad swam upstream to spawn. When the Moon is closest to the Earth on the same night as a Full Moon, it is known as a Supermoon. While Supermoons happen every year, the Moon can appear up to 14% bigger and 30% brighter and so is well worth a look!

"The Lamb and Flag" pub closure, Witney emblem and Easter

I was very sad to hear back in January that the ancient pub "The Lamb and Flag" in St Giles is not to reopen after the pandemic. As well as it being of great historic significance it is a pub which holds many happy memories for Jane and I from our courting and early married years. My hope is that it may yet be saved.

However, the symbol of the Lamb and Flag crops up in other places locally. It features on the current Arms of Witney Town Council and also features on the "Ancient seal of the borough of Witney" from 1574.



The Lamb and Flag is a very early Christian symbol. The ring around the head of the lamb is a halo because the lamb symbolizes Christ. The flag was originally just a cross which over time became a flag and symbolizes the cross of Christ.

But why the association with Witney? The answer is that the lamb and flag symbol is that of John the Baptist who was frequently associated with medieval textile or cloth guilds, one of which may have been in Witney with its history of blanket making dating back to that time and beyond.

At Easter, on the cross, Christ became the one perfect sacrificial, saving, 'lamb' echoing the Passover lamb of the Hebrew Exodus for Egypt. Famously John the Baptist is recorded as saying to his followers, on seeing, Jesus, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!". (Page 102 in your Jubilee new Testament").

What John did not know was that on Easter Sunday Christ wound rise again defeating death and giving us an eternal hope as well as sins atoned for.

PS The Lamb and Flag pub in St Giles is owned by St John's College (as it is now known) but the full name of the college is "The College of St John the Baptist". Hence the name of the pub.

The Little Things

"It's the little things citizens do. That's what makes the difference. My little thing is planting trees".

Wangari Maathai was the first African woman to win the Nobel peace prize. And she won it not for a 'little thing' but for setting up the Green Belt Movement which has planted 51 million trees in Kenya!

Concerned about the impact of colonialism on deforestation and the disempowerment of rural communities, Wangari worked with local women to plant indigenous trees from seeds they collected. This reduced soil erosion, lessened the impact of flooding and drought as well as empowering women.

Recollections of Cassington

This month we bring you the third and final installment of lan Waters' recollections from his younger days, as told to his grandson Steve Wright.

When we first had electricity you had three lights and one socket and anything else you had to pay for. It was wonderful to have electricity, being able to switch the radio on. You had a big battery and an accumulator that you had to get charged, so you'd take it up to Goodman's at Eynsham. You had to make sure you didn't get any of the acid on your clothes or it would burn a hole in it.

All the boys then used to have catapults. The first thing I hit with a catapult was myself. I was with George Hatwell going over the old gravel pit one day and he said 'I bet you can't hit that accumulator.' I

said 'I bet I could' and luckily I did! It was made of glass so all that fell off and the rest of it was hanging there. I never did live it down. Poor old George died a little while ago.

During the war the Airbases sprung up in the Cotswolds like mushrooms. We got stopped on one one day and this thing came in and it was shot to bits. We worked 24/7 and you could tell at night when there was going to be a raid, especially under a full moon. We'd be working away all under blackout at the Bicester hanger and all the pheasants would start hollering. When pheasants are hollering at night, there's something wrong. When it was nearly over, you'd see a searchlight beam and stand dead straight.

We went to school here until we were eleven and then got the bus to Gosford Hill. We always told people we went to high school because it was on a hill. At the school here, one old lady lived in the school house. There was a teacher who used to come

from Witney, get a bus to Eynsham and then bike over here. We had a good woodwork master, and if you did anything wrong in there - it was a big old building with no central heating or anything - he'd gather all the class round to have a little ceremony and he'd cremate it!

Sylvia used to get on well with the cookery teacher. I didn't have the school dinners though - I'd take my own.

The playing field wasn't there. That was all Duke of Marlborough's land and Elms Road appeared in 1946/47. As time went on, they wanted this playing field. There was talk of it being where the school is now because you'd get a bit of land off the Duke. How they got it around the Duke I don't know but they more or less got it for nothing at the top of Elms Road. We all mucked in and got that going, giving about sixpence a week to help towards it. It was a good thing and the atmosphere was different.

RECIPES OF THE MONTH

So these are both recipes for sunny days, as we emerge from lockdown and start to enjoy bbq's with friends!

The first is a Brazilian chopped salad - amazing served with anything.

Brazilian Chopped Salad

To be honest I hate long, wordy recipes with loads of detail. The reason I like this type of recipe is because it's simple & open to interpretation/variation. Quantities can be varied - everything just needs to be finely chopped, by which I mean 1-2cm (although I think this is personal taste & preference!)

Ingredients:

Tomatoes (different colours if you can), sliced and diced to a similar size as other ingredients, avocado, fennel - raw, red onion, watermelon (some people like seeds some don't!) but generally if you're finely chopping most seeds will have come out, feta, lots of fresh mint, hearts of palm (optional if you can get them - come tinned in this country so already prepared.)

Dressing: lime juice, olive oil, crushed garlic, honey, more mint & salt/pepper.

The next is a no-churn marguerita ice-cream (no ice-cream maker needed). It's really easy and great served in glasses with the rims dipped in egg white then salt!

Marguerita Ice-Cream

Serves 6:

125ml lime juice

2tbsp tequila

3tbsp Cointreau

150g icing sugar

500ml double cream

Dissolve the lime & alcohol into the sugar, add the cream & softly whip - smooth not stiff peaks. Freeze overnight in an airtight container.

The War is Still Not Won: An Update From Cassington Allotment Association

Despite the recent gale-force winds and rain spring is definitely in the air at Cassington Allotments. Frisky frogs have laid bundles of spawn in some of Sam Serra's ponds, trees are budding and in the hedges Lords and Ladies are sprouting from the ground. In the last few days we signed

another 5 year lease on Cassington Allotments which at face value seems like good news. However, this lease has a 6-month eviction clause and conversations with Dominic Hare at Blenheim Estates indicate that they fully intend to present the village with another plan for building on the allotments.

Viewing the plot via Google Earth suggest to me that this will be just the first part of a likely larger development. They have left a truncated road entrance in the Williams Court development connecting to the fields to the north which suggests an intention to build bigger.

On the positive side, the designation of Cassington Allotments as an Asset of Community Value, the fact that it is on Green Belt Land and its obvious value to wildlife as well as the well being of our village, all help to fend off this unwanted development. The fact that Blenheim Estates have shown no inclination to wait for, or participate in the Neighbourhood Plan, suggests that they prefer to steam roller the villagers and impose this development on us. We do not intend to let this happen. It is therefore extremely important that you all show us your support in the coming

months so Cassington gets the future it wants through adoption of a mutually agreed Neighbourhood Plan. Who knows, perhaps Blenheim Estates might join the village in planning our future together?

Cassington Neighbourhood Plan

Neighbourhood Plans are an important democratic process at the local level, aimed to give residents of a particular area or, in our case village, a say in the way future development takes place. The objective is to understand what people want and need in terms of the future of their place of living.

Neighbourhood Plans are very important in the context of the West Oxfordshire District Plan as they give locals an important say in any future development of settlements classed as Villages, which includes Cassington. As we have already seen, without a Neighbourhood Plan, villages have little defence against developers. Adoption of a Neighbourhood Plan is a formal process and requires approval by the District Council.

On the 22nd February the Cassington Neighbourhood Plan Committee met for the first time. The village was represented by Ian Finlay, Anne Luttman-Johnson and Alex Rogers, with Tracey Cameron, the Parish Clerk, taking notes for the Parish Council. Also present were Neil Homer and Leani Haim from Oneil Homer, a company which has consulted on about 150 Neighbourhood Plans.

The first meeting was to scope what would be required in the Cassington Neighbourhood Plan. Issues affecting the Parish were discussed including problems, threats and opportunities for the future. The main concerns raised included over-development of the village, traffic, local flooding and drainage.

Neil and Leani applied what they had learned from previous Neighbourhood Planning activities.

Most interesting was the fact that West Oxfordshire District Council appear to have completely neglected the village in terms of an impact assessment of surrounding development at Eynsham/ Salt Cross (3,200 houses) and Yarnton / Begbroke (up to 4,400 houses) on traffic, pollution and other adverse consequences.

Everyone agreed there was a very modest requirement for future housing (the recent housing survey indicated 10 social / affordable rental dwellings and 3 starter homes) but the question was where these could be built with a positive effect on the village.

Other discussion points included the need for a small village shop, the school and opportunities for local education and public rights of way to the countryside.

This is very much a process driven by the people of Cassington so we will be consulting with the village on all the matters discussed and others that are raised. In the meantime, if anyone has views or great ideas relating to the future of our village then now is the time to come forward.

Neil and Leani saw no reason why the Neighbourhood Plan could not be completed quickly but the Parish Council has to raise the funds to pay for their services. We look forward to the next meeting.

Parish Council meeting

The next Zoom meeting will be on Thursday April 1st at 7.30 pm. Please contact the clerk if you want to attend.

Blenheim proposal for allotment site development.

The Parish Council have been told by Blenheim that another plan is going to be put forward.

Horsemere Lane and Cassington Lights

The current application does not show any mitigation work at the lights with the closure of Horsemere Lane which is shown in the application. OCC have set up a working party for these and other issues to be discussed. The first meeting is planned for Friday 19th March, which is too late for a report in this issue. Information should be available for the Parish Council meeting.

Website.

Work in very much in progress and the clerk hopes to have a draft for comment in April.

School crossing/ 20mph zone. (as last month)

The clerk has been in touch with OCC regarding the rollout of this initiative and is awaiting further information.

Tree Planting Recreation field

The Parish Council have received tremendous support for this with 9 sponsorships coming forward. The contractor has been given the order and it is hoped that the trees will be planted later next month.

A40 Park and Ride Proposal

The Parish Council were presented with a new document outlining the time scales and more details on the proposal on Friday 19th March. It does seem that we may now have a conduit to put forward our requirements around the closure of Horsemere lane and revisions at Cassington Lights.

A meeting has been arranged for us to put forward our ideas. If you require a copy of the proposal from Friday 19th March please contact the clerk and a copy will be forwarded. We will discuss this in detail at the Parish Council meeting on the 1st of April and would invite all to let us know your concerns for presentation on Wednesday 7th April. All correspondence to the clerk.

As a starter these are some issues already raised: -

- Slip road and revisions to sequencing of the lights
- Noise from both the construction process but also road noise from the proposed surfacing

Gardening Tips for April



- Plant veg seeds but be very vigilant about ground frosts, use fleece not bubble wrap as bubble wrap causes condensation and then freezes on the seedlings.
- Start chitting your early potatoes.
- Dig and prep your veg garden and work out your planting rotation.
- Scarify your lawn and use a plugger to aerate it to help prevent lawn moss.
